Bratt’s essential historical documentary, she became “a dancer on the stage of justice.” A talented and tireless community organizer, Huerta discovered her purpose among the perennially exploited Latinas and Latinos laboring for Northern California agribusinesses. Nothing could slow Huerta’s war on poverty, pesticides, injustice, and racism—until a San Francisco cop badly injured her during a Union Square protest in 1988.

In this new documentary, director Peter Bratt deploys remarkable and little-seen archival footage along with highly emotional interviews with many of Huerta’s eleven children. Their sacrifices, along with hers, are shown as heartbreakingly but magnificently.
