Mentoring for Academic Success (MAS) continues to assist underserved students with their academics in West Berkeley since 1999. The students are tutored by university level tutors from UC Berkeley and Berkeley Community College four days a week. Some Berkeley High School students stop by once a week to volunteer as well. The students range from 3rd to 9th grade and come from different schools in Berkeley. MAS resumed on September 15th and will go on until May 7th of next year. Meeting with the Berkeley Police Department:



MI continues to have on-going communication with both the City of Berkeley and the Berkeley Police Department (BPD) about neighborhood situations that include the day laborer population in West Berkeley. At their August meeting MI staff met with Officer Rashawn Cummings from BPD and gave an update about the day laborer program, Mentoring for Academic Success (MAS) after school program, health program, and the GED Spanish preparation courses MI offers. An update about the new computer lab and classes was also given. Best strategies to address non-emergency neighborhood situations were discussed as well. Overall, MI and Berkeley Police Department will continue to be in close communication.

The Multicultural Institute connects homeowners, contractors and event planners with an extra pair of hands. We are not involved in actual hiring or payment; and it is not our role to check laborers' work eligibility or provide worker's compensation insurance.

Reserve affordable and reliable laborers for your construction, moving, hauling, gardening, set-up, clean-up, painting, house cleaning and more.

Day laborers are available 7 days/week; starting at \$15/hr. Give us 24 hour notice.
